# Master of Education in Instruction

The University of Virginia Curry School of Education and the School of Continuing and Professional Studies Richmond Center will offer the Master of Education in Instruction program beginning Spring 2006.

The program is designed specifically with the needs of the classroom teacher in mind. The curriculum translates the knowledge and skills of resident Curry faculty members into experiences that will help practicing teachers become more effective professionals.

Students who complete this program will emerge as exemplary teachers. They will be current in their fields and committed to a lifetime of professional growth. They will serve as role models and shape opinions within their schools. They will be the teaching professional who lead education into a new era.

### Admission to the Program:

- Applicants should be practicing teachers. This program will require that participants apply the practices they discuss in their own classrooms and share the experience and results with their colleagues.
- Two letters of recommendation are required for application, but one must be from the applicant's principal.
- Applicants are required to follow the standard procedures for admission to graduate programs in the Curry School of Education at the University of Virginia and meet all UVA admission requirements. A cohort of 30-35 students will be selected.

#### United States Citizens

U.S. citizens must submit required materials by [deadlines](#) specified by the [program areas](#) to which they are applying. **Only complete application packets will be reviewed.** Packets must contain the application form with signed honor code, official transcripts of previous undergraduate and graduate work, official Graduate Record Examination scores (General Test verbal, quantitative, and analytical writing), at least two letters of recommendation, a statement of professional goals, and a \$60 non-refundable application fee.

All GRE scores must be current (taken within five years of date of application). Examinations should be taken as early as possible, so that scores will be available prior to the application deadline. For scores to be sent directly to the Curry School, you must mark UVA Code 5820, Department Code 3999 on the GRE registration form. Information on GREs may be obtained directly from the [Educational Testing Service](#) or from the [Office of Admissions](#).

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Applicants to the Postgraduate Master of Teaching (PGMT) program must also submit PRAXIS I , SAT, or ACT scores. See the Curry [Application Checklist](#).

## International Students

International students must submit application materials by March 1 for the summer/fall semesters and October 1 for the spring semester. Only complete applications, submitted in official form, will be reviewed. (Note: Students applying for financial aid must submit materials by February 1.)

Complete applications must contain the application form with signed honor code, official transcripts of previous undergraduate and graduate work, Graduate Record Examination scores (General Test verbal, quantitative, analytical writing), Test of English as a Foreign Language (TOEFL) scores, at least two letters of recommendation, a statement of professional goals, the Financial Guarantee and Personal Data for Foreign National Applicants Form, and a non-refundable check in the amount of \$60. The check must be payable in U.S. dollars and payable at a U.S. bank.

All GRE scores must be current (taken within five years of date of application). Examinations should be taken as early as possible, so that scores will be available prior to the application deadline. For scores to be sent directly to the Curry School, you must mark UVA Code 5820, Department Code 3999 on the GRE registration form. Information on GREs may be obtained directly from the [Educational Testing Service](#) or from the [Office of Admissions](#).

Scores for the **Test of English as a Foreign Language (TOEFL)**, administered by the Educational Testing Service (ETS), must also be current. The required TOEFL score is 600 (paper-based) or 250 (computer-based). The TOEFL cannot be waived. Information about the test can be obtained from the [Educational Testing Service](#).
