HIGHLIGHTS

- Academics:** Designated as the first IB World School in Hanover County; 15 students received an IB diploma last year. State SOL scores include the following: Reading - 94%, Writing - 91%, Math - 87%, History - 92%, and Science - 92%.
- Athletics:** The Atlee softball team marched through the state playoffs, winning their 2nd consecutive state championship in dominating fashion. The Raiders also had an individual swimming state champion, multiple conference and region championships and saw more than 30 seniors commit to play their respective sports at the collegiate level.
- Extra-curricular activities:** The 2015 Legend yearbook received an All-American rating from the National Scholastic Press Association, a gold medal rating from the Columbia Scholastic Press Association and a VHSL Trophy class rating, which is equivalent to a state championship. Two photography students placed first and second in the state multi-media contest sponsored by the VHSL. DECA won first place in state competition and had 17 finalists in different categories in state competition who qualified for international competition. DECA finished the year with an international first place team for Advertising Campaign event, one top 10 international finalist, and two top 20 international finalists. Cindy Garrett, Atlee DECA advisor, was awarded Outstanding New Advisor for the state. Destination Imagination Team placed 1st in the regional competition. The Junior Agricultural Mechanics Team placed first in the state, the Agricultural Sales team placed 2nd in the state, and the FFA Chapter was rated Gold and a 2-Star National Chapter. The Junior Forestry team placed 3rd in the state and the Robotics team won the Central Virginia District Imagery Award.
